Sample survey of the first five days of detention in Chile -
January - August 1979 (THE CHART)

Chilean legislation allows for the detention of a person for up to five days without charge. During this time they are at the disposition of the Minister of the Interior. After five days the detainee must be charged or released. Although notification of the detention should be given (to the detainee's lawyer or family, for example) after 48 hours, people are generally held incommunicado for the full five days. It has become increasingly clear that during these first five days detainees are tortured, maltreated or punished in a cruel, inhuman or degrading fashion. AI has made a small survey into the way in which detainees are arrested

and the conditions in which they are initially held. It is based only on cases about which the organization has sufficient information.

From January until August 1979, 816 politically motivated detentions were recorded in Chile. A hundred and sixty individual cases and two large group arrest cases of 50 and 62 people were selected for the survey. The 160 individual cases include only 36 of the nearly 500 people arrested following the 1 May International Labour Day demonstrations - which means that the survey is of only about a third of the reported detention cases. However, the study of these cases seems to indicate the type of treatment detainees get from different arresting bodies.

For instance, the chart reveals that the vast majority of people arrested by CNI (Central Nacional de Informaciones; National Centre of Information) agents or armed civilians (who probably belong to the CNI) are taken to secret places of detention and tortured. Similarly, the majority of those who claim to have been maltreated or who do not complain about their treatment have been arrested by the carabineros (uniformed police) and held in official detention centres. Although occasionally one hears of torture by the carabineros or by others in official detention centres, torture (with electric shocks, by suspension or severe beatings) is not apparently often inflicted by the carabineros. However, there are many cases of maltreatment or of humiliating treatment by the carabineros (for instance, some beatings, body searches and molesting of women by male officers).

Conclusions of the relevant section of the United Nations Working Group on Chile's report tally with Amnesty International's observations:

"... torture is used very frequently in interrogation, often against persons who are not even charged with any offence, but from whom it is desired to obtain information, denunciations, or false statements implicating others in acts of a political nature that are punishable under the legislation in force."

The chart reveals that more than 50 per cent of those detained by the CNI or by armed civilians and later held in secret detention places and tortured are released without being charged.

Below are some extracts from the testimonies of people detained during 1979.

June 22-23 1979: José Gaspar Hernandez Bustos

Held for only a short time. The following is an extract from a request for court protection which is reproduced by the United Nations:

"... they made us get out and go down a staircase to a cellar we seemed to be in a corridor and we could hear the groans and shrieks of people who were being interrogated. The grand-daughter of the owner of the house (where he had been detained with five others) was interrogated for the whole morning and for a long time I could hear her screams of pain ..."

28 May 1979: José Nazario Reyes Valenzuela

After detention, he was put in the luggage compartment of a taxi and taken to a place he could not identify, where he was held in a windowless room only 1.6 metres square. There they stripped him and hung him up, constantly giving him electric shocks. They interrogated him about alleged connections with the Vicaría de la Solidaridad and with certain priests. He was held there for three days and, on the third day, was taken by car to another place he could not identify where he was held together with others. He was released uncharged on 4 June.

April 1979: (Name withheld by AI)

He was arrested at 3 am by eight CNI agents and kept under house arrest until the following afternoon when the victim was blindfolded and taken to a secret detention centre which he thought might have been a building once belonging to the National Health Service near Mapocho Station. The following is the victim's own testimony:

"Upon arrival at this place, I was stripped naked and hung up. I was made to do rapid physical exercises for about one hour. I was also punched all over the body. During this period I was interrogated about my alleged political activity.

When this first interrogation had finished, they dressed me and took photographs of me. I was then brought to where two of my friends who had also been detained were and was later taken to another room, on the second floor where I was interrogated until about midday. During this interrogation, they applied electric current to me through the parrilla - that is, they tied me to a metal bed frame to which they applied current of varying intensity. They also applied current direct to my tongue, ears, genitals, hands, head and feet. I was subjected to intense interrogation during this treatment. They left me locked up with my friends and at one stage a so-called doctor arrived who proceeded to examine us later they took me to another room where once again they stripped me completely and sat me down in a chair the arms of which were made of metal. They handcuffed me to the arms of the chair. This time, they applied electric current to my hands and punched me on the face. This lasted for about an hour."

The detainee goes on to recount various details of the treatment he was given, which included a period of some 21 hours spent handcuffed and seated under an intense spotlight. He was subjected to further sessions of interrogation on the parrilla, on one occasion on the instructions of a female interrogator and in the presence of a doctor who was there to observe his reactions and judge his level of physical resistance.

After this session of interrogation, the doctor examined him and told him that he was physically fit. The doctor made him sign a paper which he could not see but which the doctor said was a declaration that he had not been tortured.

This detainee was finally released on bail but less than three months after his initial detention he was arrested again by the police probably as a result of mistaken identity, and interrogated yet again. Once more he claims to have been beaten and tortured with electricity during the interrogation. The Investigaciones police who arrested him confiscated his identity card and released him some five hours after his arrest.
