



The government of Chile is overthrown by General Pinochet in a military coup on September 11th. Even US Intelligence estimates 5,000 men, women and children are murdered in the next 3 months and 20,000 are dead by 1976. Over 20,000 political prisoners are held in concentration camps and many of them are tortured. In response the world unites in condemning the barbarity of the Chilean regime; both in the General Assembly of the United Nations and through the breaking by many countries of trade and diplomatic links with the Chilean Junta.

Ten years on, the Pinochet regime is still in power, and widespread Human Rights violations continue. There are still hundreds of political prisoners in Chilean jails, people are held incomunicado and tortured in the special detention centres of the secret police and mass arrests have become commonplace. At the same time the Junta's free-market economic model has led to widespread poverty, with 30% unemployment and the destruction of the previously existing health and education services. However throughout the ten years of military rule, the Chilean people have never given up hope and today the Church, Human Rights and grass-roots organisations are active throughout Chile, adding their voices to the rising tide of protest against the Pinochet regime's continual violations of Human Rights. These groups need our support.



In this tenth year of repression in Chile, international support and solidarity are as crucial as ever. This year, the Chile Committee for Human Rights is launching a series of campaigns, publications and public events to draw attention to the situation in Chile and defend Human Rights there.......YOUR SUPPORT IS VITAL!!!

THE CHILE COMMITTEE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

The Chile Committee for Human Rights was set up in January 1974 after the brutal military coup in Chile. Over the past 9 years, the committee has taken up the issues of Human Rights violations, such as torture, the plight of the disappeared prisoners and internal exiles. CCHR monitors the situation in Chile, informs the British public of current repression and campaigns for the restoration of full Human and Democratic rights in Chile.

CCHR works closely with the Church and Human Rights Organisations in Chile and establishes direct contact and programmes of support for these groups through its associated charity, THE CHILE RELIEF FUND. MSS. 109/144/63
